

What is (sexual) health?

"...a state of physical, emotional, mental and social well-being in relation to sexuality; it is not merely the absence of disease, dysfunction or infirmity. Sexual health requires a positive and respectful approach to sexuality and sexual relationships, as well as the possibility of having pleasurable and safe sexual experiences, free of coercion, discrimination and violence. For sexual health to be attained and maintained, the sexual rights of all persons must be respected, protected and fulfilled."

 biopsychosocial framework: an approach to describing and explaining how biological, psychological and social factors combine and interact to influence physical and mental health

Health care professionals can't afford NOT to work on sexuality!

"All patients recieving nursing/midwifery/occupational therapy care are 'at risk' of developing sexual problems as every physical, mental or social problem can in turn create sexual difficulties"

Example: 53 year old women consults because of lack of sexual desire. Estrogen treatment by the gynaecologist, because of a possible relation to her menopause, did not work. Lack of desire turned out to be avoiding frustration because she can't allow penetration anymore in the positions the couple always uses because since her replacement hip surgery 2 years ago. Practical counselling about 'hip friendly positions' during penetration solved the problem.



Health care professionals can't afford NOT to work on sexuality!

What if...

Example: 53 year old women consults because of lack of sexual desire.

What if the nurses during post op care or rehabilitation related to the hip replacement surgery would have talked about sex (prevention)?

What if the gynaecologist/midwife would have looked past the own discipline (menopause) and thought more broadly about causes for sexual problems?



Almost ½ of women and more then 1/3 of men experience sexual difficulties [Flemish numbers].



Blended Intensive Program on Sexual Health!

General Learning outcomes:

Theory & Practice:

- Students have practical insights into the concept sexual health and how it connects to their patient population.
- Students have a working knowledge of sexual development throughout the life span.
- Students have practical insights into the biopsychosocial mechanisms of sexual functioning (desire, arousal, orgasm, etc.)
- Students have practical insights into sexual dysfunctions and how they appear in their patient population.
- Students have practical insights into the development of care policies and protocols in healthcare settings and how they pos./neg. impact on sexuality.
- Students can preventively engage in conversation with patients on sexuality and provide basic information and counseling on their level of expertise.
- Students have basic sex research skills.



Concept of the BIP Elective Course Sexual Health

Intensive program of 1 week in september (Summer school) + evening seminars throughout the 1st semester regarding the broad concept of sexual health and the impact on health in general.

Special focus on sexual problems connected to:

- Physical and mental disability
- Physical / Chronic / psychiatric illness
- Big Life Events (pregnancy and postpartum, divorce, loss of partner, etc)

Combination of theory and practice (clinical reasoning, communication, etc)

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Target Audience - Eligibility

Students from the department of Healthcare

 Occupational Therapy, Midwifery, Nursing, ...having completed at minimum 120 ECTS credits of their BSc. We encourage applications from student who are in their final year / have had more practice experience.

- Candidates record a short (max. 2 min) video explaining their motivation to take part in the BIP Sexual Health in Flanders Belgium.
- Ranking based on motivation and English language skills to be done by local departments.



Selection criteria & deadlines

Criteria

- Working knowledge of English (reading, speaking, writing)
- Student in the field of Occupational Therapy, Midwifery and/or Nursing
- Has completed a minimum of 120 credits within the own degree program.
- Respectful stance towards the topics of sexuality and relations
- Previous experience with intercultural projects
- Previous experience with interdisciplinary projects
- Previous clinical experience, either professional or internships
- Substantiated motivation and expectations towards the implementation in their professional career.

Video submission: 2023, April 1st

Ranking by the institutions where the students are enrolled: 2023, May 1st
